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CREATING A SAFE PLACE TO LEARN

By providing a welcoming haven for women who have experienced the hardship of poverty, domestic violence, war, natural disaster, family tragedy, and immigration, we ensure that learning and empowerment thrives.

MLC teacher Alla Schlate hosts a monthly community lunch for her English As A Second Language students: "Feeling supported by your peers creates a safe learning environment. Most of these women have problems at home and stress they have to deal with, but when they come here, I want them to feel excited and happy to come to class. Our monthly lunch creates that connection and community with each other."

Alla's students shared: "We get together each month to celebrate all cultures the students represent with a focus on the students who have their birthdays that month. We bring our favorite food and soft drinks to share with everyone in the class. We describe how we prepare the dish and why it is our favorite. We also talk about how different foods are prepared for certain occasions. For example, Slavic people prepare Olivie (potato salad) and Venegret (beets salad) for special occasions, like birthdays and the New Year Eve. The most popular Brazilian food is Feijoada (black beans, different part of pork, and paio, calabrese) served with rice, kale, orange salad and fried bananas. Everyone enjoys relaxed atmosphere and, of course, learn new words connected with food and cultural traditions."
